Use Change Mitigation – Solar Electrification of rural villages:

GRSP ensured the broad participation of female community members in the community election process. The results of this engagement were reflected in the election of female community members to the CDC which provided a forum to air and discuss the issues directly affecting both male and female community members.

Socialization:

One of the main objectives of the energy project promoted by GRSP is to enhance the social cohesion among the community members so that they organize and implement the sustainable rural energy project to meet their demands. Social contacts develop understanding cooperation and coordination with the communities. Community involvement, women participation and cultural practices, are important factor s for success of project Social mobilization through raising awareness and mass meetings should be carried out to enhance the socialization in the community.

Implementation :

Projects are implemented by the community /CDCs or Cluster of CDC (CCDC), the processes, procedures, rules and regulations governing the project implementation should be as straightforward and simple as possible. GRSP provides the monitoring support and depending upon the type of projects they also provide technical support by hiring a technician. Community or CDC members involvement during the implementation process should be ensured. Working methods should be discussed with the stakeholders and verified in order to ensure that they understand these properly and adequately. GRSP supports the implementation of those projects for which the community may take ownership, operate and manage with some training provided to them.

GRSP supports different part of energy projects identified by the communities. Communities are involved in all steps of the project cycle. Major activities for energy promotion through GRSP include:

1- Raising Awareness

- 2- Community Level Planning
- **3-** Social Mobilization
- 4- Survey and Design
- 5- Implementation
- 6- Operation and Maintenance
- 7- Capacity building activities
- 8- Gender Mainstreaming





Women Peace and Security –basic literacy Education:

Afghanistan is improving its economic stability and population life expectancy, and moving forward in terms of education and gender equality. The Taliban's banning of education for girls significantly hindered women's literacy, but since they lost power, education for women has become increasingly important: it is reported that 39% of the country's students are now female.

The literacy lessons were imparted through standardized methods, such as reading aloud in class, writing in notebooks and memorizing words,. Bridging learning in and outside the classroom through their books was very effective and encouraging for students, who were able to see immediate progress and feedback on their developing literacy skills. Literacy skills became less of a task without a clear benefit and more of a useful skill that helped them to communicate in daily life and to increase their understanding of the world around them.

Due to the situation of education for women in Afghanistan, the imparting of literacy skills is very important, and this programme heralds a new means by which to do so. The project has been implemented in two districts at 20 Learning Centers, reaching out to 300 women from each. These centers were selected for the strong community or CDC members cohesion that is present in the villages, which supported the implementation of literacy projects. The close proximity of the villages to one another also ensured consistent communication between staff.GRSP considered conducting a number of programs related to education during 2014-2015.

Illiteracy is the underlying cause for many problems that rural people face in communities in Aushturly and Kejran districts. It not only causes problems, but is also the big barrier for women to access many opportunities and resources.







